About the Southern Colorado Conservation Award

The 11th annual Southern Colorado Conservation Awards will honor the significant achievements of individuals and organizations that, through their conservation efforts, advance the future wellbeing of southern Colorado's communities, people, ecologies, and economies. The event focuses on conservation achievements in the broadest sense—knowing that successful conservation involves more than just resource protection; it involves a wide variety of champions across political, educational, business, research, and land management spectrums.

Award Categories

The Stuart P. Dodge Award (focus: lifetime achievement)

The Stuart P. Dodge Award honors an individual or organization for a lifetime of conservation achievement. The award is inspired by Stuart P. Dodge, whose exceptional service to Colorado set a benchmark for conservation leadership throughout the state.
